5. Shinness Wind Farm

Presentation by Ron Shanks

Project began in 2005 when John White approached Mr Shanks re looking at plans for potential wind farm development at Shinness. Mr Shanks formed part of the Altnaharra wind farm development.

Class 1 wind site, no SPAs, statutory designations.

The Shinness Grazing committee and landholder Chris Fletcher agreed to - private shareholders development

2018 Shinness Wind Farm ltd created. Opened to Shiness community 72 homes invited to join SWF 18% now own 15% of the company.

Proposal - 2 design workshops, consultation HC, SEPA, Nature SCot ECU scoping process. Gearing up to final design

16 turbines - 200m base to tip, 155m rotor, accessed from A838 just past West Shinness. On site substation and battery energy storage facility. 105.6 megawatts capacity

Infrastructure - tracks, met masks, no impact to peat or peat soil. 2 lines of turbines on thinnest peat field. Biodiversity and habitat management plan. Woodland plan. Deer management plan, agreement with crofters restrict use of the hill for grazing, improve grazing in lower fields.

Development operational for 40 yrs. 2030-2032 grid connection date (National Grid/SSE)

Section 36 application with scot gov beginning of april (18mths - 2yrs) 2026 decision expected

Community benefit £5000/megawatt

Wind Farm company committed to Houses in Shinness - £1250 per annum energy contribution, power contribution, top up to community fund.

£20 million over 40 years for community funds

IT attended meeting - 9 turbine scheme above woodland at Balblair. Access: Rogart, Lairg, Forestry Commission woodland by Invershin or existing pylon line. Not spoken to community councils Creich/Ardgay. Historic arrangement LCC
